

General Guidelines for Paper Presentation

WORLDCON 2026

1. Presentation Category and Format

- Oral presentations will be conducted under the **Free Paper Sessions** for:
 - Residents
 - Young Surgeons
 - Consultants
 - Each presenter will be allotted **6 minutes** for the oral presentation, followed by **2 minutes** for questions, critical appraisal, and academic discussion.
 - Participants are required to **strictly adhere to the allocated timeframe**. The judging panel will enforce the time schedule rigorously to ensure equity, uniformity, and academic fairness across all presenters.
 - Presenters are strongly advised to carry their presentation file on a **USB storage device** as a backup to prevent disruption due to unforeseen technical contingencies.
 - The recommended presentation format is **Microsoft PowerPoint** to ensure system compatibility.
 - A maximum of **four (4) slides** is advised to facilitate focused, concise, and high-impact scientific communication within the stipulated time.
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2. Mandatory Presentation Components

Each paper presentation must clearly include the following details on the opening slide:

- **Title of the Paper**
 - **Full Name(s) of Author(s)** along with institutional affiliation(s)
 - **Official Email Address(es)** of the corresponding or presenting author
 - **Type of Manuscript**, clearly specified (e.g., Case Report, Original Research Article, Systematic Review, Meta-analysis, Clinical Study, Technical Note, etc.)
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3. Recommended Structure for Research-Based Presentations

For original research or scientific studies, the following structured format is strongly recommended:

- **Introduction and/or Objective**
(Clearly defining the research question, hypothesis, or clinical relevance)

- **Methodology**
(Including study design, sample size, inclusion/exclusion criteria, statistical analysis, and ethical approval where applicable)
- **Results**
(Presented concisely with relevant statistical data)
- **Conclusion and/or Discussion**
(Highlighting clinical implications, limitations, and scope for future research)
- **Acknowledgements**
(If applicable)

The presentation should reflect scientific rigor, methodological validity, and evidence-based interpretation.

4. Design and Visual Clarity Guidelines

- All textual content must be **clearly legible from an appropriate distance within the auditorium setting**.
 - Utilize **tables, graphs, charts, and clinical images** where scientifically appropriate to enhance clarity and facilitate data visualization.
 - Only **key and relevant references** should be included to support scientific claims, avoiding excessive citation.
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
